EUROPLANTS ® was established as a commercial part of the wholesale "Nursery Charles Van Herreweghe B.V.B.A." which was founded in 1977. This nursery is managed by Dirk and Luc Van Herreweghe who are assisted by 7 master craftsmen. They aim at a high standard quality that even exceeds the ISO 9 norm.

The nursery is producing trees, shrubs, roses and fruit trees on about 35 ha quality land in Flanders, which is known as one of the best horticultural areas in Belgium.

A wide range of cultivars of the following tree species are available as bare root or containerized (from 20 to 200 litres) : Acer, Aesculus, Alnus, Betula, Corylus, Fagus, Carpinus, Crataegus, Fraxinus, Gleditsia, Laburnum, Malus, Prunus, Quercus, Salix, Sorbus, Syringa, Tilia.

Our trees are available in a wide range of forms, including newly grafted rootstocks, 1 year Maidens, 2 year Feathered and 3 year light standards (from 6 till 14/18 cm).

The above-mentioned trees can be obtained in containers : they are called "Europlants Speciality" (ES-container).

EUROPLANTS ® Roses are a tradition in Flanders. We can even speak about the Flanders Rose Valley. Europlants is situated in the centre of this valley (Wetteren) and is one of the most important rose growers in Belgium, with 120.000 pieces of own production and about 400.000 pieces under subcontract.
